Step into the World of the Nutcracker Girl and Find Your True Self!

Into the Fantasy of Nutcracker, this production, which began in 2023, will complete its trilogy with a final chapter in 2025. At its heart, the story revolves around "facing challenges and finding courage." In the first installment, a little girl flips through a pop-up book and embarks on a journey with the Nutcracker and Sugar Plum Fairy, confronting her fears while embracing hope throughout their magical adventure.

The second part transforms the girl's experiences of growth into a series of exotic journeys that begin after she leaves the Snowflake Kingdom, with richly diverse characters appearing at different stages of her life. In the final chapter, the girl has grown up. Follow her as she journeys between the enchanting realms of Nutcracker fantasy and reality, embarking on a mesmerizing adventure that resonates with your soul.

Synopsis

Act I

Past and Present

A grown-up girl looks back on her childhood memories: her favorite Nutcracker doll, her gentle and patient dance teacher, her protective fencing instructor, and the boy who was always there to help her. Of course, she also remembers the proud senior dancers she could never quite catch up with no matter how hard she tried, and the strict art teacher whose very presence sent chills down her spine. Finally, she arrives at her graduation ceremony—the conclusion of her student years. She bids a temporary farewell to the clumsy, struggling, but never-giving-up version of herself. With fully charged energy toward the future, the first sweet and sour hint of young love has arrived quietly.

Chasing the dream of becoming a dancer is never easy. In reality, dancing joyfully is followed by shifts at a restaurant just to make ends meet. Even as an adult, she still gets into trouble as a daily routine: getting picked on by coworkers, scrutinized by the supervisor, wishing she could simply disappear into a corner to survive.

On Christmas Eve, the restaurant is busy preparing for the holiday dinner. While sneaking a quick break, she accidentally drinks a guest's wine. Unable to hold her liquor, she ends up singing and dancing uncontrollably on the small stage meant for the carol singer. The sharp and icy restaurant owner explodes with fury, scolding her on the spot and dragging her off the stage.

Back Into the Dream

After the outburst, the tipsy girl slips into a daydream-like fantasy world. She recalls the fairy tale that always gave her strength when she felt lost—the Nutcracker—reminding her never to forget her Dreams and Courage. The Christmas tree awakens as if touched by magic, the real and the imagined intertwine once again. Squeaks comes from corners of the restaurant, the servers transform into an army of mice, the Mouse King and Queen reappear! Her fencing teacher returns from his Nutcracker-ornament form to human shape; the boy becomes a young commander leading the troops; and the gentle yet brave "Half-Sugarplum Fairy" re-emerges to protect her once more. Plates, forks, and knives become

weapons on the battlefield; terrified guests scatter, as the battle between humans and mice erupts again.

Justice triumphs. The girl and the Nutcracker, the Sugarplum Fairy and the boy defeat the mouse army, and journey together through the glittering, snow-white Kingdom of Snow.

Act II

Finding Her Best Self

They arrive at the Sugarplum Fairy's fantastic palace, welcomed by pink-petaled sugar sprites. A multitude of vibrant characters appears, each symbolizing a different path in life and endless possibilities. Together they celebrate the young woman and the boy, who have overcome their trials. The stubborn Mouse King and Queen return to capture the boy once more. And yet in this dire moment, the girl gathers her courage and takes control of a grand cannon—modified from a Nutcracker doll—and with the help of the Christmas gingerbread men, finally defeats the Mouse King and Queen for good – at the same time conquering the timid part of herself she once feared.

In the final scene, together with the Nutcracker and the Sugarplum Fairy, she dances a graceful, radiant waltz. At this moment, the girl has finally blossomed—resilient, mature, and beautiful, just like the Sugarplum Fairy herself. The fairy-tale of growing up has accompanied her all along, reminding her never to lose her courage—so she can always meet the very best version of herself.

From the Choreographer

In the slit of time, woven by rushes between north and south, between time and reality, I journeyed with many companions to bring *Into the Fantasy of Nutcracker* to life over the course of 3 years. Throughout rehearsals and production, a question often crossed my mind: "What makes people in Taiwan—where winters are mild, at most damp and chilly—look forward to Christmas so eagerly?"

As the work gradually took shape, the answer grew clearer.

Dreams take me back twenty years, to the version of myself who longed for the ballet stage, and to all of us who were still taking on the path of growing. My heartfelt thanks to everyone who took part in and supported this production, and to every audience member who steps into the theater. Because of you, *Into the Fantasy of Nutcracker* can move closer to its dream, and let its light truly shine upon the stage.

From the Production Consultant

My idea of Christmas has always involved Christmas cards, and so it turns out that, in the first year of *Into the Fantasy of Nutcracker*, there was a giant pop-up book appeared on stage, having a Christmas tree, a Nutcracker, the Mouse King, and even the Snow Kingdom in it. As the lights shifted, the dancers seemed to step right out of the storybook into reality. This was how choreographer YEH Ming-hwa began: perhaps living in Taiwan means we must create some of our own collective memories! So that ballet does not feel distant from our lives.
